

... promotes academic exchange between Bavaria and countries in Central, Eastern and Southeastern Europe


... is an institution of all Bavarian universities, universities of applied sciences and art academies

The one-year scholarship program



- started with 4 countries (Poland, Hungary, Slovakia and the Czech Republic) in 1991 and was gradually enlarged up to 10 countries
- BAYHOST has been overseeing the one-year scholarship program since 2004; implemented own selection process
- joint program with BTHA since 2016
- is based on bilateral cooperation between the Free State of Bavaria and its partner countries









Funding figures at a glance 2003/04-2021/22

total of **456** scholarship holders, thereof distribution according to degree




and according to study subjects








Funding figures at a glance 2003/04-2021/22

41 scholarship holders in the academic years 2016/17 - 2021/22





- Nothing can replace human contact, but the docents in Bayreuth did really good job

- Study material is always available. Accessible
- It's flexible.

Advantages of online education

- Accesibillity
- Usefulness
- Possibility of later reproduction of materials
- The ability to use all resources of human knowledge
- Lack of phisical context
- Multisensory nature of the message/knowledge especially YT: https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=KVLTxKyxioA (access: 19 June 2022)

Disadvantages of online education

- Lack of human contact
- Lack of deeper relations beetween students, teachers and also: students and lecturers
- Lack of (propper) educational resources (especially: text/books and articles)
- Sometimes: Lack of lecturer' ICT skills and boring style of lectures

Areas to improve in online education for the future

- Lecturers' ICT skills
- Improvement of multisensory style of lecturing by (some) teachers and lecturers
- Accessibillity of (good quality) subject textbooks/manuals, articles (PDFs)
 and additional learning materials (especially: presentations)
- Preparation of special educational online channels like YT Sprouts

Our experience with online education during the pandemic



Advantages

- Opportunity to stay longer in your home country
- Saving time, money, energy
- Inverted classroom
- Hybrid teaching format
- Self-paced study: flexible hours of studying; more convenient and comfortable

Disadvantages

- Lack of socialization
- Time to adapt to online studying
- Technical issues (e.g. Internet connection)
- Takes more time to study
- Lack of interaction during the online classes





What should be maintained?

- Inverted classroom
- Hybrid teaching format

What should be improved?

- Technical side (e.g. Internet)
- Involvement of students

- Andrijana Bakračević, PhD student in International Law at FAU Erlangen-Nürnberg, BAYHOST scholarship holder
- > During the pandemic period, lectures and consultations were held exclusively online, and later on a dual basis, where we had the option to participate online or live.
- > The benefits of exclusively online teaching are time management, reduction of costs, better networking opportunities, reduction of destruction-better focus, etc.
- ➤ Disadvantages are: online learning may create a sense of isolation, especially when you are in a foreign country, in a short period of time must provide all the technical conditions that are challenging when immigrating, also means more time spent in front of the screen, lack of opportunities for basic socialization in a foreign country.
- ➤ In the future, we should consider a dual system that would mean that we can always opt between online and live lectures because this combination gives the best results.

(+)

- better organization of the courses (online scripts, other materials)
- improvement of online platforms and administration
- possibility of taking part in lectures during private trips
- saving time on travelling to the university
- safety during the pandemic time

- lack of contact to new students, socializing events, networking events, coffe between or after classes with other students, lack of exchange of academical thoughts etc.
- closed libraries & other spaces for studying
- too quick change between the present and online forms
- harmful for the eyesight
- reduced practial courses

Suggestions for improvement and/or maintenance

Improving

- more work shop ideas (e.g. LMU's Walking Buddy Programme) to help new students gaining contacts
- make online education more structured, better organized in time
- better communication greater involvement of student associations

Maintaining

- improved online platforms
- more administrative work done digitally (e.g. via email)
- all materials being uploaded online
- the possibility of taking part in present and online form paralelly (separately or together, e.g. present class with zoom meeting on or recording of lectures)

My experience with online education during pandemic

- Considering music is live art, it is very hard finding balance at the beginning with online playing.
- The main problem was not having the proper equipment for the audio-visual recording and online lessons (like good quality microphones, good camera...).
- Online classes in which we had to play were more difficult to follow. considering Zoom and other apps were not created to provide best sound quality, it is very challenging (speaking while playing, or giving online concerts).

Pros and Contras regarding online education

*Pros

- -spending less time in public transport while going to University
- -lectures are recorded, possibility of playback
- -living at parents house, not paying for students dorm
- or private house
- -eating healthier food

*Cons


- -not able to interact well with other colleagues
- -spending to much time at home, sitting
- -less socializing at Uni
- -not able to make new friends at Uni
- -less enthusiasm for studying

Suggestions for improvement online education

*Improvements

- Making online classes more interesting
- Students should get always opportunity to take part in every class
- University should cover Internet expenses
- Poor video or audio quality should be discussed and should not influence student's grading
- Universities should have their own streaming platforms that have all necessities for students
- University webpage should contain visible tutorials and guidelines on how to properly use and take part in online lessons

General experience

- Lectures, seminars and tutorials online
- Foreign language not problematic
- Using Zoom and e-learning platforms (GRIPS, Moodle)
- Exams via e-learning platforms
- Submitting thesis, essays or projects
- Access to online library





Positive

- Saving time and money on travelling
- Fostering interactivity due to innovative digital tools (ex. polls in Zoom)
- Enhancing digital skills of professors and students
- Feeling of equality amongst students and reduced pressure of public speaking





Negative

- Reduced opportunities for debate
- Hard to concentrate
- Technical difficulties
- Hybrid classes are not successfully carried out





Improvement for the future

- Innovative teaching: digital Q&A sessions with students
- International conferences with researchers from all over the world (mitigated bureaucratic issues, less resources needed)
- Virtual networking tool for Bayhost scholarship holders (common chat, dashboard...)

- · sharing additional material


DISADVANTAGES

- · software and hardware issues are crucial
- lack of concentration
- hard to find participants for the group projects

FUTURE WORK

- hybrid online meeting format when necessary;
- reduced time between lectures/classes promotes a more rational studying schedule;
- · involve all participants in the discussion
- · training on digital software to enhance efficiency when holding online classes
- improve technical equipment
- · build hubs near dormitories
