Fundamental Rights 21 250 - Grundrechte

The general doctrines of fundamental rights and namely different protective dimensions are dealt with, as well as specific fundamental rights and their enforcement through the constitutional complaint procedure at the Federal Constitutional Court ( <i>Bundesverfassungsgericht</i> ).
