Language Requirements

All applicants for the M.A. English Linguistics must possess an excellent command of the English language at level C1 or higher (or equivalent) according to the Common European Framework of References for Languages (CEFR).

All M.A. students without prior German language skills must acquire German language skills at level A1 (or equivalent) according to the Common European Framework of References for Languages (CEFR) or attend at least 120 hours of instruction in German language courses during their first year of studies.

The University of Regensburg offers several German language courses.

Course Registration

Registering for courses and module exams is a two-step process. To get a place in the courses you are interested in, you must register in SPUR before the beginning of the lecture period. Registration typically takes place approximately from the end of January to mid-March for the summer semester and from mid-July to mid-September for the winter semester. Please check the course details of each course in the course catalog to find the exact registration dates.

To get credit points (ECTS credit points) for the courses you attend, **registration in FlexNow is mandatory**. The FlexNow registration period typically starts in the third week of the lecture period and ends about three weeks before the end of the lecture period. When you register in FlexNow, you must decide which courses will count towards which (sub-)module and, therefore, in which course(s) you will write a term paper to get credit for the module exam.

Registration for the M.A. Thesis (Masterarbeit)

To register for your Master's thesis, you must have completed modules ELG-M1-4 and have at least 24 credit points from modules ELG M 5-8. There is no fixed date at which to register your thesis, but note that after registration, you have four weeks

NB: You must submit the thesis before the end of your sixth semester in the program in order not to fail the first attempt by default.
